The Role of Institutions in Society:

1. Definition of Institutions:

Social life is organised by institutions, which are dependable, cherished, and repeating behavioural patterns. They are well-established social order structures that regulate how members of a society behave.

2. Functions of Institutions:

- a. Socialization: institutions provide roles, values, and norms.
- b. <u>Regulation of Behaviour:</u> institutions provide laws and regulations that govern both individual and collective behaviour.
- c. Social integration: they foster a feeling of community and common identity.
- d. <u>Fulfilment of Basic Needs:</u> survival and security are guaranteed by institutions such as the family and the economy.
- e. <u>Maintaining Social Order:</u> institutions foster stability through roles, regulations, and power structures.

3. Types of Institutions and Their Roles:

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


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4. Institutions and Social Change:
