- **Lead (Lede):** The first paragraph that answers the most important questions: Who, What, When, Where, Why, and How (**5Ws & 1H**).
- **Body:** Provides more details, background information, and supporting facts.
- **Conclusion:** Includes less important details or additional context.

#### IV. Types of News Writing

- **Straight News:** Focuses on facts without interpretation.
- **Feature Stories:** More descriptive and detailed.
- **Editorials:** Express opinions (usually written by editors).
